

Exclamations are a most primitive expression of communication. They are most useful in everyday language, showing the speaker interest and responsiveness from the listener.

■ Get into the habit of responding with exclamations to a variety of situations in life [!]

■ A very simple way of making an exclamation is by using "HOW + an adjective/adverb"

How nice! How fast!

■ There are other more sophisticated forms of exclamations...

They often involve question-tags:

Rather cold, isn't it!

Negative questions are frequently heard as exclamations:

Wasn't it a surprise!

Americans use positive questions, too:

Boy, am I hungry!

Was I furious!

Gee! It's pouring!

Wow! That's brilliant!

■ Most frequently, we make exclamations involving a combination of **adjective+noun**, in which case we have to discriminate between <u>singular/plural</u>, <u>countable/uncountable</u> nouns.

What a nice dress! What an easy exam!

What smart shoes! What nonsense!

■ The same rules for HOW/WHAT above apply to exclamations with SO/SUCH:

It's **so** kind of you! **How** kind!

She's **such a** helpful fellow What a helpful fellow!

They talk **such** rubbish! **What** (a lot of) rubbish they talk!

They're **such** friendly folks! **What** friendly folks!
