Functional language frequently used in speech ...

...to start a conversation with a stranger / to draw somebody's attention:

►

Excuse me.

- ...to introduce a question:
- Can/Could I ask you a question?
- Let me ask you something.
- ...to introduce a suggestion:
- Listen... / Why don't we...?
- Let's...! / Shall we...?
- I'll tell you what...
- ...to give yourself time to think /

to show that you're about to answer:

- ► Well, er... / All right, uh...
- ► Let's see...
- ► Let me think/see...

...to express uncertainty / hesitation:

- Perhaps / Maybe.
- Who knows?
- I'm not sure.

...to show that you couldn't understand what someone said:

- (I beg your) Pardon?
- Sorry. What did you say?
- I'm sorry. Can you say that again?

...to agree with the speaker:

- (Yes) That's right / You're right.
- Absolutely.
- Me too/neither.

...to show disagreement:

- I don't think you're right.
- (I'm afraid) I don't agree with you.

...to make sure the listener understands:

- You know what I mean?
- You see?

...to give listeners their turn to speak:

- How/What about you?
- What do you think about it?
- How do you feel about that?
